On 15 March 2020 the President of the Republic of South Africa declared the Corona Virus also referred to Covid-19, a national disaster after the World Health Organisation (WHO) had declared it a global pandemic. "The world is facing a medical emergency far graver than what we have experienced in over a century", these words by President Ramaphosa and his subsequent declaration of the national state of disaster in terms of the Disaster Management Act, changed the day to day lives of everyone living in South Africa.

Lockdowns were introduced with stringent regulations on movement which saw schools, workplaces, businesses, transport services and a lot of activities not operating as a way of trying to slow down the spread of the virus. Food parcels were given to the needy through public -private partnerships.

# MEC'S PRONOUNCEMENTS AND COMMITMENTS AMIDST COVID19

he MEC for Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure Namane Dickson Masemola, delivered Vote 9 Budget Speech recently highlighting the departmental achievements during 2019/20 financial year and plans for 2020/21. The budget speech was delivered through virtual platform due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### The following were achieved for 2019/20 financial year:

•A total of 87, 62 km of roads at a total cost of R1, 150 Billion •Upgrading of laundry services completed at Mankweng Hospital •Three traditional council offices

which are Rambuda. Mudavula offices in Vhembe District and Dikgale in Capricorn District.

#### The following plans are for 2020/21 financial year:

### Roads Infrastructure

 $\Rightarrow$  Fourteen (14) road upgrade projects spanning about 85 km in various parts of the province with two (02) bridges at an estimated cost of R662 million

### Infrastructure operations

- $\Rightarrow$  The renovations of the 36-bed female surgical ward at Letaba hospital will be completed in 2021/22.
- $\Rightarrow$  Upgrading laundry services at St. Rita and Pietersburg hospitals will commence during 2020/21 financial year
- $\Rightarrow$  Construction of Emergency Medical Service (EMS) in Bosele is at the tender stage, construction works is to commence during the financial year
- $\Rightarrow$  Lebowakgomo EMS is at design stage and is scheduled to be on advertisement during this first quarter of the 2020/21 financial vear
- $\Rightarrow$  Upgrades of the four (4) nature reserves is progressing well
- $\Rightarrow$  The construction of the fifty-nine (59) school projects that was supposed to commence

during the third quarter of 2019/20, will now commence in 2020/21 financial year - Six (6) schools of the 59 are at an advanced stage and contractors will take sites soon

- ⇒Three (3) traditional council offices. Mphaphuli, Masia and Ditlou Machidi are currently under construction
- $\Rightarrow$  The process of appointing a contractor who will complete construction works at the Mogashoa Dithlakaneng traditional council office - This is after the initial contractor was terminated due to poor performance.

### Maintenance of government buildings

⇒The department will commission forty-five (45) maintenance projects for the 2020/21 financial year. This is an ongoing initiative to ensure that immovable assets owned by government remain in good condition. Furthermore continue to work with the affected stakeholders to ensure realisation of the long outstanding programme of relocating District Offices of Sekhukhune from Lebowakgomo to Jane Furse.

#### •During the 2020/21 financial, the department will complete

- $\Rightarrow$  The construction of the Out Patient Department (OPD) at Maphutha-Malatjie
- $\Rightarrow$  Upgrading of the laundry services at Tshilidzini and Letaba hospital
- $\Rightarrow$  The construction of Molemole Agriculture

### Job creation

- EPWP  $\Rightarrow$  Through its the Department will ensure the set target for the Limpopo Province of 475 358 work opportunities which is 9.4% of the National target and will ensure continuous implementation of the programme without any failure.
- $\Rightarrow$  The department is in the process of finalising review of the the organisational structure in consultation with the Provincial Treasury and the Office of The Premier and the targeted for completion by the end June 2020.

On issues concerning Audit, SCOPA, Portfolio Committee is worth noting that for the period 2014/15 to 2018/19; the department has had a qualified audit opinion with different findings emanating from different programmes, and in terms of the House Resolutions, 80% progress on Portfolio Committee and 79% progress on the Standing Committee on Public Accounts resolutions were registered. The Department remains determined to implement the house resolutions and outstanding audit findings from the previous financial years also continuously implementing the corrective action plan with solid and timebound remedial actions designed to address these critical financial and governance matters. The remedial actions are based on

the root cause analysis undertaken to eliminate the irregularities and ensure that they not recur.

Note that an amount R1 478 676 000.00 in Programme 4 (Roads Infrastructure) budget is transferred to Roads Agency Limpopo.
