CAPRICORN DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY LAUNCHES EPWP FORUM

On the 11th of July 2013 the last EPWP District Forum was launched at Capricorn District Municipality (CDM). The event followed after the launching of Sekhukhune, Mopani, Vhembe and Waterberg District Municipalities after they signed Incentive Agreement Protocol.

The launching of District Forums is part of the implementation of resolution from national Public Works EPWP Summit held in November 2011under the theme "Accelerating towards delivery of 4, 5 million work opportunities for the poor". The Head of Department of Public Works, Mr Madidimalo Chaamano acknowledged the challenges faced municipalities in terms of reporting on work opportunities created through EPWP projects and emphasised that municipalities should work harder in creating more work opportunities through Infrastructure projects.

In her remarks former MEC for Limpopo Department of Public Works (LDPW)," Mme Thabitha Mohlala said, "the Limpopo Provincial Summit held from 12 to 13th of July last year committed municipalities to plan in advance in order to access Incentive Grant well on time and enable to report accordingly". Mohlala further indicated that other reasons for having District Forums was to ensure the signing of Incentive Agreement protocols by Mayors' for adequate implementation

The same event was also beneficial to Local Municipalities as they were handed title deeds, Polokwane Local municipality received seven (07) title deeds, Molemole local Municipality received one (01) title deed, Blouberg Local Municipality received one (1) and Lepelle - Nkumpi received fourteen (14) title deeds.
