In a continuous effort to render quality infrastructure delivery to the community, Limpopo Department of Public Works as a leader in the provision and management of provincial government buildings continues to provide Infrastructure to the community of Vlakfontein, Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality.

Funding was provided for the construction of Vlakfontein Community Library as part of community library service conditional grant from the National Treasury to aid in building, upgrading and equipping of libraries.


## SERVICE DELIVERY AT ITS BEST
