## Waterberg EPWP Forum Launch



District Mayor receive incentive Agreement protocols while Local Municipality looks on.

On the 14<sup>th</sup> of August 2012 the first District Forum was launched in Waterberg District at Mogalakwena Local Municipality. The launch was well attended by the Mayors in the Waterberg District Municipality, Councillors and other stakeholders. In her remarks during the Launch MEC Thabitha Mohlala indicated that the Provincial EPWP Summit committed municipalities to plan in advance in order to access the Incentive Grant well on time and to report accordingly. The MEC further indicated that the other reason for having District Forums was to ensure that the Incentive Agreement Protocols signed between Mayors and the Minister are adequately implemented. Mme Mohlala acknowledged challenges still faced by municipalities in terms of reporting on work opportunities created through EPWP projects and emphasized that this will be corrected through the EPWP District Forum.

The National Department of Public Works held an Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) Municipal Summit in November 2011 at Gallagher Estate under the theme: "Accelerating towards the delivery of 4, 5 million work opportunities to the poor". The Limpopo Department Of Public Works hosted the Provincial EPWP Summit on the 12<sup>th</sup> to the 13<sup>th</sup> July 2012. The Summit was successful as it has paved ways and has had municipalities committed to the implementation of EPWP.

The launching of District Forums is part of the implementation of the resolutions from the National EPWP summit. This conscious decision was taken to strengthen participation of municipalities and to ensure that Incentive Agreement Protocols signed between Mayors and the Minister is adequately implemented.

The same event was also utilized to handover title deeds as the three Municipalities receive title deeds for farming land for agricultural purposes, Mogalakwena Local Municipality received two title deeds, Mookgopong Local Municipality received one title deed and Lephalale Local Municipality received two title deeds.

## Minister awards best performing province

**Q:** How do you balance your personal life and work?



## What does women's day mean to you?


