INTERNATIONAL MEN'S DAY WORLDWIDE OBSERVANCE OF – 19 NOVEMBER 2012

THEME 2012: “POSITIVE MALE ROLE MODELS”

International Men's Day is a time for many people to reflect on the contribution, sacrifices and progress made by men in society. Such progress includes that of working with women to make educational, economic, social, and technological advances in society.

The inaugural observance was held in Trinidad and Tobago on 19 November 1999. International Men's Day focuses on improving gender relations, promoting gender equality, producing responsible males and highlighting positive male role models. A petition has called for the UN to make International Men's day an official UN observance in the interest of quality because presently it is not an official observance but there is support from the UN.

Studies have shown that involvement of parents and positive male role models in the lives of children has profound effects. It promotes physical wellbeing, perceptual ability and competency for relating with others. These kids have also demonstrated greater ability to take initiative and evidence of self-control.

The following are ways of getting involved:

- If you are a positive role model, you can involve yourself in the lives of children and young people in your community who can benefit from your influence
- You can respect yourself, you can respect women, respect children and treat others as you would like to be treated.
- You can make your health a priority to hopefully live longer and be around until your children are old enough and independent.
- If you are a non-custodial dad you can make an effort to visit your child more often and be intentional about teaching them important life lessons.
- If you are an educator you can encourage fathers to take on more active roles in their child's school work.
- If you are in government you can encourage general positive male role modelling amongst your colleagues, be involved in community mentoring groups, sport and youth groups etc.
- If you are a faith based organisation and non-profit organisation you can provide programs and bring fathers together with their children and also encourage male role models to be involved with children in their sphere of influence.
