STATE-OF-ART HOSPITAL TO TRANSFORM HEALTHCARE

remier Dr. Phophi Ramathuba officially launched and handed over a newly constructed state Maphutha-Malatji -of-the-art Outpatient and Clinical Support facility in Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality, Mopani District in December 2024. The Maphutha-Malatji Hospital is a public healthcare facility and lifeline for many communities in and around the Ba-Phalaborwa Community Limpopo - ideal to cater and support the growing population mainly through the mining and tourism sectors which dominates industries in the area.

The construction and upgrade of the Maphutha Malatji Hospital by Limpopo Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure was undertaken to meet the growing healthcare needs and enhance healthcare service delivery of the local communities of Lulekani, Mashishimale, Makhusane and Selwane on behalf of the sister Department of Health. The upgrades has modernised healthcare improved infrastructure, medical equipment. The infrastructure include the state of the art Paediatrics and Neonatal Ward, radiology, dental and staff wellness centre, laboratory and victim support, administration area, staff cafeteria, pharmacy. The construction included the upgrading of sewer line, electrical bulk service to cater for increased electrical loads, new sports field and water storage as backup for at least 72 hours during water shedding.

The hospital, according to Premier Dr. Ramathuba shows the provincial government's dedication to improving healthcare services not only to the community of Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality but also the tourism industry. "The hospital will provide the muchneeded healthcare services to the

community members even tourists visiting the Kruger National Park with proper medical care", alluded Premier Ramathuba.

The project such as this one contribute to the social and economic development of the region by providing jobs during construction and improving the overall quality of life. This project aligns with the government's goals of enhancing public health infrastructure and achieving universal health coverage for all South Africans.


The procuring of the fleet was as per the commitment made by MEC Ernest Rachoene when he launched the Dikgerekgere Wednesday programme in July 2024. The

Bulldozers: Level ground, push soil, and clear obstructions to create a flat base for the road.

Road Maintenance:

Cold Planers (Milling Machines): Remove damaged asphalt concrete layers in preparation for resurfacina.

Patching Machines: Fill potholes and repair cracks to maintain road usability.

Crack Sealing Machines: Apply sealants to cracks to prevent water penetration and further damage.

Furthermore the department has appointed 172 workers who will mostly be linked to the road maintenance programme.

MAVHUNGA COMMUNITY RECEIVES ACCESS ROAD AT LAST

n the 23rd of October 2024 the MEC for Limpopo Department of Public Works, Roads, and Infrastructure, Mr Ernest Rachoene, handed a contractor for the construction of Mavhunga access Road D3669 in Makhado Municipality.

The total stretch of road D3669 to be upgraded is 3.7km which links the villages such as Phadzima, Mavhunga and Rabali within the Makhado local Municipality which lead N1.

"In his key note address, MEC emphasized that the importance of quality in infrastructure development plays a critical role in driving economic growth in the province".

MEC Rachoene also highlighted that the project will empower local communities by providing employment opportunities for local labourers and subcontracting work of Small and Medium Enterprises (SMMEs) as a key component of the Department's infrastructure development initiatives.

The event was followed by a sod-turning ceremony that symbolised the continuation of the road construction project.

The MEC was joined by Makhado Local Municipality's Cllr Dorcas Mboi and a representative of the Vhembe District Municipality Executive Mayor, Cllr Miyelani Mabanana Chauke, RAL's Accounting Authority, Mr Moses Tseli, Acting CEO Mr Makhita Chesane, and Senior Management from Public Works, Roads, and Infrastructure.



SPEED KILLS - Slow down. Driving too fast is a contributing factor in 75% of the over 12 000 fatal crashes annually.

REDUCE SPEED - Be patient. A decrease of 10% in speeds reduces fatal crashes by 40%.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY - Be cautious. Nearly 40% of the people killed on our roads are pedestrians.

PEDESTRIAN VISIBILITY - Wear visible clothing. A pedestrian wearing white clothing is visible at 55 meters, while if wearing a retro-reflective material s/he will increase visibility to a distance of 150 meters.

ALCOHOL - Sober up. Drunk driving kills. It is illegal to drive under the influence of alcohol or other drugs. Maximum punishment for drinking and driving is R120 000 AND OR 6 years imprisonment.

FATIGUE - Rest every two hours/200 km. It is a silent killer! A tired driver is a danger on the road.

VEHICLE FITNESS - Service your vehicle. Maintain your vehicle properly – for your safety and that of other road users.

K53 TESTING CENTRE TO ENHANCE ROAD SAFETY SERVICES

eshego K53 Driving Licence Testing Centre is currently under construction as part of efforts to reduce pressure on existing traffic facilities in Polokwane. This is one of the Department of Public Works, Roads

Infrastructure project which constructed on behalf of sister Department of Transport and Community Safety as part of government's effort to address infrastructure gaps and improve service delivery. This R50 million project started in 2023, where the department will be constructing a new driver testing centre with vehicle testing pit, and fence.

The construction will assist and alleviate the pressure at the current traffic facilities and enhance accessibility for residents of Seshego and surrounding area even support government's road safety initiatives of ensuring a structured and efficient testing environment.

The initiative is also part of the broader efforts to decentralize essential services and boost local infrastructure development while delivering services closer to the residents.



STAY SOBER TO SAVE LIVES

he "Arrive Alive" program is a road safety initiative aimed at reducing traffic accidents and fatalities, especially during high-traffic periods like holidays. This entails government law enforcement agencies' intensified efforts on accident prone routes with activities that include increased traffic law enforcement, roadblocks, and public education campaigns.

Initiatives under this program also focus on addressing common issues

like overloaded vehicles, driving under the influence and driver fatigue. To further promote road safety, competitions like the "Taxi and Truck Driver of the Year" were introduced to encourage adherence to traffic laws. Pedestrian safety is also a priority, with calls for visible clothing and safe road behavior.

Traffic officials are tasked with strict enforcement of rules and are reminded to avoid corruption to maintain the program's integrity.



SOLIDARITY TO END GENDER BASED VIOLENCE

Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence Campaign is an international moment to call for an end to violence against women and children. It from 25th November International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women) until 10th December, Human Rights Day. The period includes the World AIDS day which is commemorated on 1 December 2024 and the International Day for Persons with Disabilities on 3 December. During this period, all government spheres together with civil society and the private sector host a series of community and sector dialogues and activities to foster a collaborative effort in dealing with gender based violence and femicide (GBVF)

The GBVF happens in every country culture, causing physical, emotional and psychological harm to millions of people worldwide. The campaign emphasizes addressing the root causes of violences by masculinity, positive promoting gender and creating equity, economic opportunities for women and children. This year it was celebrated under the theme "30 Years of Advancing Collective Action to End Violence Against Women and Children".

The President of the Republic of South Africa Honorable Cyril Ramaphosa in September 2019 declared the plague of Gender-Based violence in the country as a national address for government to implementing the Emergency Response Action Plan on Gender-Based Violence and Femicide.

To commemorate this period, the department joined the world by arranging a Thursday in Black, a symbol of strength and courage to show solidarity with victims and survivors of sexual violence – calling for the world without rape and violence. Although the day is celebrated weekly in the department, the Acting Head of Department, Mr Motlhanke Phukuntsi led the team to partake on this global movement that started in 1970s of resisting attitudes and practices that permit rape, abuse and violence.




